General Guidelines

FASC Bowling Cup (unofficial name given to the FASC bowling series by the undersigned)

Each FASC club sets up a bowling program for its members. It is a club event with an individual ranking.

Α.

3 meetings must be held per annum:
1st meeting between 1st Oct & 31st December
2nd meeting between 1st Jan & 31st March
3rd meeting between 1st April & 30th June

Members can choose individually the dates they want to play during these three meetings.

B.

To be eligible for the final "FASC Bowling Cup" ranking with prizes a member must have submitted scores of 2 games from each of the three meetings thus adding up to a total of 6 games for the 3 meeting periods.

There will be prizes for the Best Lady Bowler and the Best Gentleman Bowler with smaller prices for 2nd and 3rd places.

Honors may go the club with the highest score obtained by their members, but the formula for this has not yet been decided.

A second ranking will be established to rank those who have played less than the total of 6 games that are required for eligibility for the FASC Bowling Cup. Here also prizes may go the top scoring lady and top scoring gentleman.

C.

Results must be submitted to FASC latest by the end of each meeting period. They will be published on the FASC website.

D.

What matters is that you get out of your chairs and out to the bowling lane to have some fun, laughter and exercise, and enjoy the time out.
